## You Can Make a Difference in Children's Oral Health:

When tooth decay goes untreated, the consequences can be serious and lifelong.



**Tooth decay is the most common disease of childhood.**

**4x** more common than early-childhood obesity.

**5x** more common than asthma.

**20x** more common than diabetes.

In FY 2025, 2,916 South Dakota Medicaid-enrolled children received care under general anesthesia for severe tooth decay, a highly preventable disease.

**Fluoride varnish\* reduces tooth decay by**

**↓ 37%**

\*Fluoride varnish is an evidence-based standard of care that is supported by AAP, Bright Futures, AAFP, USPSTF, ADA and AAPD.

**Three interventions can stop the painful impacts of tooth decay.**

- 1 Screen**  
Spot tooth decay early and prevent painful cavities from occurring.
- 2 Educate**  
Teach parents and children about oral hygiene and healthy eating.
- 3 Apply Fluoride**  
Apply fluoride varnish to protect teeth from decay.

## Delivery of oral health services can pay off.

SD Medicaid allows fluoride varnish reimbursement 3x per benefit year for children under the age of 21. The ACA requires all insurers to cover fluoride varnish with no copay.
